

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Fort Worth's Westside All-Stars Little League
2 baseball team won the 2002 Southwest Little League Championship
3 and advanced to the semifinals of the 56th Little League World
4 Series; and

5 WHEREAS, The Westside All-Stars defeated Texas East champion
6 First Colony American of Sugar Land 2-0 to garner the 2002 Southwest
7 Little League title and become the first Fort Worth team in 42 years
8 to reach the Little League World Series; and

9 WHEREAS, The talented team from Texas advanced to the
10 semifinals and lost 2-1 against the Louisville, Kentucky, team that
11 went on to win the championship; proving themselves to be
12 formidable competitors, these young men played 11 hard-fought
13 innings, a Little League World Series record, which included both
14 starting pitchers throwing a no-hit shut-out for the first six
15 innings; the game also had a record 49 strikeouts, with 21 of them
16 by Westside's Walker Kelly; and

17 WHEREAS, Led by team manager Jon Kelly, who was assisted by
18 fellow coaches Mitch Belew and Joe VanderHamm, these outstanding
19 Little Leaguers are Mitchell Belew, Patton Eagle, Mark Grace,
20 Chester Hamilton, Jack Huckabay, Walker Kelly, Robby Lebus, Robert
21 Ratliff, Rand Ravnaas, Chris Rivera, Mikey Valdez, and Jeffrey
22 VanderHamm; and

23 WHEREAS, In addition to showing the world that they are
24 talented athletes, these ballplayers demonstrated admirable

1 character by dedicating their games to Bobby Ratliff, teammate
2 Robert Ratliff's father, who is battling cancer; and

3 WHEREAS, The Westside All-Stars played with determination
4 and outstanding sportsmanship, and the Lone Star State takes great
5 pride in all they have accomplished; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas
7 hereby honor the Westside All-Stars for being 2002 Southwest Little
8 League Champions and semifinalists in the 56th Little League World
9 Series and commend the players and coaches on a sterling season;

12 prepared for the team as an expression of high regard by the Texas
13 House of Representatives and Senate.
