

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the issuance and expiration of certain licenses to
3 carry a concealed handgun.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 411.173(a), Government Code, as amended
6 by Chapters 255 and 752, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
7 Session, 2003, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 (a) The department by rule shall establish a procedure for a
9 person who meets the eligibility requirements of this subchapter
10 other than the residency requirement established by Section
11 411.172(a)(1) to obtain a license under this subchapter if the
12 person is a legal resident of another [a] state [~~that does not~~
13 ~~provide for the issuance of a license to carry a concealed handgun~~]
14 or if the person relocates to this state with the intent to
15 establish residency in this state. The procedure must include
16 payment of a fee in an amount sufficient to recover the average cost
17 to the department of obtaining a criminal history record check and
18 investigation on a nonresident applicant. A license issued in
19 accordance with the procedure established under this subsection [~~If~~
20 ~~a state whose residents may obtain a license under this subsection~~
21 ~~enacts a law providing for the issuance of a license to carry a~~
22 ~~concealed handgun, a license issued to a resident of that state]:~~

23 (1) remains in effect until the license expires under
24 Section 411.183; and

1 (2) may be renewed under Section 411.185 [~~until the~~
2 ~~time a license issued by the other state is recognized by this state~~
3 ~~under Subsection (b)~~].

4 SECTION 2. Section 411.173(b), Government Code, is amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (b) The governor shall negotiate an agreement with any other
7 state that provides for the issuance of a license to carry a
8 concealed handgun under which a license issued by the other state is
9 recognized in this state or shall issue a proclamation that a
10 license issued by the other state is recognized in this state if the
11 attorney general of the State of Texas determines that a background
12 check of each applicant for a license issued by that state is
13 initiated [~~conducted~~] by state or local authorities or an agent of
14 the state or local authorities before the license is issued [~~to~~
15 ~~determine the applicants' eligibility to possess a firearm under~~
16 ~~federal law~~]. For purposes of this subsection, "background check"
17 means a search of the National Crime Information Center database
18 and the Interstate Identification Index maintained by the Federal
19 Bureau of Investigation.

20 SECTION 3. Section 411.183(b), Government Code, is amended
21 to read as follows:

22 (b) A renewed license expires on the license holder's
23 birthdate, five [~~four~~] years after the date of the expiration of the
24 previous license.

25 SECTION 4. Section 411.173(a-1), Government Code, is
26 repealed.

27 SECTION 5. This Act applies only to a license renewed on or

1 after September 1, 2005.

2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.


