4 SECTION 2. Subchapter T, Chapter 61, Education Code, is  
5 amended by adding Section 61.858 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 61.858. STATEWIDE EVALUATION. (a) In coordination  
7 with tech-prep consortia, including the governing board of each  
8 tech-prep consortium, the board shall develop and implement a  
9 statewide system to evaluate each consortium based on the success  
10 of the consortium's tech-prep program and other appropriate  
11 criteria. The evaluation system must include standards that a  
12 tech-prep consortium, including the consortium's governing board,  
13 is expected to meet in administering the consortium's duties under  
14 this subchapter.

15 (b) Using the criteria developed under Subsection (a), the  
16 board shall evaluate each tech-prep consortium biennially. Not  
17 later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the board shall  
18 report to each tech-prep consortium the results of the evaluation.  
19 The report must discuss any failure of the tech-prep consortium to  
20 meet a standard established under Subsection (a) during the  
21 reporting period, recognize the achievements of the consortium,  
22 including the consortium's meeting of standards during the  
23 reporting period, identify areas in which the consortium has made  
24 improvement or should take steps to improve its performance, and  
25 identify best practices of tech-prep consortia.

26 (c) Not later than October 1, 2006, the board shall issue  
27 the initial reports required by this section. This subsection

1 expires October 31, 2006.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
