

AN ACT

relating to the identification of and provision of assistance to colonias and for tracking the progress of certain state-funded projects that benefit colonias.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subsections (a), (c), (d), and (e), Section 405.021, Government Code, as added by Chapter 828, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, are amended to read as follows:

(a) In this section, "colonia" means a geographic area that:

(1) is an economically distressed area as defined by Section 17.921, Water Code; ~~and~~

(2) is located in a county any part of which is within 62 miles of an international border; and

(3) consists of 11 or more dwellings that are located in close proximity to each other in an area that may be described as a community or neighborhood.

(c) The secretary of state shall compile information received from the Office of Rural Community Affairs, the Texas Water Development Board, the Texas Transportation Commission, the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, the Department of State Health Services, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, the Health and Human Services Commission, the Texas Cooperative Extension, councils of governments, an institution of higher education that receives funding from the state for projects

1 that provide assistance to colonias, and any other agency
2 considered appropriate by the secretary of state for purposes of
3 the classification system.

4 (d) The secretary of state shall compile information on
5 colonias that is received from the colonia ombudspersons
6 [~~ombudsmen~~] under Section 775.004.

7 (e) The secretary of state shall:

8 (1) with the assistance of the office of the attorney
9 general, prepare a report on the progress of state-funded projects
10 in providing water or wastewater services, paved roads, and other
11 assistance to colonias; and

12 (2) submit the report to the presiding officer of each
13 house of the legislature not later than:

14 (A) December 1 of each even-numbered year, if
15 funds are appropriated specifically for the purpose of preparing
16 and submitting the report; or

17 (B) if funds are not appropriated as described by
18 Paragraph (A), December 1, 2010, and December 1 of every fourth year
19 following that date.

20 SECTION 2. Section 487.060, Government Code, as added by
21 Chapter 828, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005,
22 is amended to read as follows:

23 Sec. 487.060. REPORT TO SECRETARY OF STATE. (a) In this
24 section, "colonia" means a geographic area that:

25 (1) is an economically distressed area as defined by
26 Section 17.921, Water Code; [~~and~~]

27 (2) is located in a county any part of which is within

2 (3) consists of 11 or more dwellings that are located

5 (b) To assist the secretary of state in preparing the report
6 required under Section 405.021, the office on a quarterly basis
7 shall provide a report to the secretary of state detailing any
8 projects funded by the office that serve colonias by providing
9 water or wastewater services, paved roads, or other assistance.

10 (c) The report must include:

11 (1) a description of any relevant projects;

12 (2) the location of each project;

13 (3) the number of colonia residents served by each
14 project;

15 (4) the exact amount spent [~~cost~~] or the anticipated
16 amount to be spent on each colonia served by [~~cost of~~] each project;

17 (5) a statement of whether each project is completed
18 and, if not, the expected completion date of the project; and

19 (6) any other information, as determined appropriate
20 by the secretary of state.

21 (d) The office shall require an applicant for funds
22 administered by the office to submit to the office a colonia
23 classification number, if one exists, for each colonia that may be
24 served by the project proposed in the application. If a colonia
25 does not have a classification number, the office may contact the
26 secretary of state or the secretary of state's representative to
27 obtain a number. On request of the office, the secretary of state

1 or the secretary of state's representative shall assign a
2 classification number.

3 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
4 amended by adding Section 531.0141 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 531.0141. REPORT TO SECRETARY OF STATE. (a) In this
6 section, "colonia" means a geographic area that:

7 (1) is an economically distressed area as defined by
8 Section 17.921, Water Code;

9 (2) is located in a county any part of which is within
10 62 miles of an international border; and

11 (3) consists of 11 or more dwellings that are located
12 in close proximity to each other in an area that may be described as
13 a community or neighborhood.

14 (b) To assist the secretary of state in preparing the report
15 required under Section 405.021, the commission on a quarterly basis
16 shall provide a report to the secretary of state detailing any
17 projects funded by the commission that provide assistance to
18 colonias.

19 (c) The report must include:

20 (1) a description of any relevant projects;

21 (2) the location of each project;

22 (3) the number of colonia residents served by each
23 project;

24 (4) the exact amount spent or the anticipated amount
25 to be spent on each colonia served by each project;

26 (5) a statement of whether each project is completed
27 and, if not, the expected completion date of the project; and

3 (d) The commission shall require an applicant for funds

8 contact the secretary of state or the secretary of state's
9 representative to obtain the classification number. On request of

12 SECTION 4. Subdivision (2), Section 775.001, Government
13 Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (2) "Colonia" means a geographic area that:

15 (A) is an economically distressed area as defined
16 by Section 17.921, Water Code, and consists of 11 or more dwellings
17 that are located in close proximity to each other in an area that
18 may be described as a community or neighborhood; and

19 (B) is:

20 (1) located in a county any part of which is
21 within 50 miles of an international border; or

22 (11) located in a county:

23 (a) any part of which is within 100
24 miles of an international border; and

25 (b) that contains the majority of the
26 area of a municipality with a population of more than 250,000.

27 SECTION 5. Section 775.003, Government Code, as added by

7 coordinator determines have the largest colonia populations; and

17 colonias in the counties for which the ombudspersons [~~ombudsmen~~]
18 were appointed and provide the information to the secretary of
19 state, to assist the secretary of state in preparing the report
20 required under Section 405.021.

21 (b) To the extent possible, the ombudspersons [~~ombudsmen~~]
22 shall gather information regarding:

- 23 (1) the platting of each colonia;
- 24 (2) the infrastructure of each colonia;
- 25 (3) the availability of health care services;
- 26 (4) the availability of financial assistance; and
- 27 (5) any other appropriate topic as requested by the

20 amount of assistance given to a county or project;

21 (4) establish by rule minimum road standards a
22 county's colonia access roadway proposal must meet to be awarded a
23 grant;

24 (5) establish by rule grant application procedures;

26 (6) establish by rule financial reporting
27 requirements for counties that receive assistance for colonia

1 access roadway projects to serve border colonias.

22 Section 17.921, Water Code; or

23 (B) has the physical and economic
24 characteristics of a colonia, as determined by the department.

25 SECTION 10. Subchapter A, Chapter 51, Education Code, is

12 has a program in the area of community, rural, or urban development
13 shall create partnerships with governmental agencies and counties
14 to implement programs, policies, and strategies to develop
15 alternative technologies to assist colonias that have inadequate
16 services or are without services, including water, wastewater,
17 utility, transportation, housing, and public health care services.

18 SECTION 12. Subchapter E, Chapter 5, Water Code, is amended
19 by adding Section 5.1781 to read as follows:

20 Sec. 5.1781. REPORT TO SECRETARY OF STATE. (a) In this
21 section, "colonia" means a geographic area that:
